

A brief history of the Harry Young, Inter-Club Competition.

1. The charter document, passed by the Victoria and District golf association in 1980, proposed an annual competition for "golfers who by reason of age, and ability level do not qualify for Willie Park, Senior buttons or City Buttons play"
2. HARRY YOUNG, the business and golf editor for the Daily colonist and governor of the royal Canadian golf Association, lent his name to the tournament and took an active interest in the competition until his death in 1992.
3. The competition has always been overseen by members of Uplands, John Pierpoint, 1980-1996: Jack Kirkham, 1997-2000: David Shaw, 2001 to present.
4. The trophy given is an authentic AUTHTERLONIE hickory shafted driver from the royal and Ancient golf Club of St. Andrews and was provided by Fred Worthington in 1981. Fred was a friend of Harry Young and at the time of this report was an active member of Uplands.
